

Recognizing Emerging Leadership

NCJW GNO is proud to recognize Sara Lewis with the NCJW Emerging Leader Award, established at the National level for each Section to pay tribute to a member, new to the NCJW scene, who shows great promise for future leadership.

Sara has been a board member of NCJW since 2021. After volunteering on

the development/fundraiser and membership committees, she spent two years chairing the Community Needs Committee which evaluates services for our section and determines the funding for each service. Last year, she chaired the Hannah G. Solomon Selection Committee and

led the planning for the community celebration luncheon.

According to former NCJW President Gail Pesses, "Lewis is known to express concern for others and how they are doing, bringing policy down to a person-to-person level."

Sara is an attorney, practicing in the areas of oil and gas, environmental and commercial litigation and is a partner with Wall, Cook & Lewis, LLC. She earned her law degree and mediation certificate at Tulane University, magna cum laude, receiving the Dean's Scholarship. She also completed an externship with Judge Fredericka Wicker of the Louisiana Fifth Circuit Court of Appeal as well as an externship on domestic violence at Southeast Louisiana Legal Services

with Judge Bernadette D'Souza.

Sara is currently the NCJW Vice President of Advocacy and is spearheading efforts on behalf of repro and LGBTQ rights.

Presidential MESSAGE



Since the horrific attacks on October 7, the Jewish people has been transformed into a global shiva house of support and presence as we mourn the tragic loss of

life in Israel and in Gaza.

Many of us have families and friends in Israel, yet all of us have been affected in some way by this violence. The uncertainty and fear about what will come next and the anxiety about rising anti-Semitism here are causing many of us to feel a bit off kilter, unbalanced. Our hearts are broken into many pieces.

But we are also a people of action and through NCJW, nationally and in New Orleans, we are responding in ways to support both the people in Israel and ourselves.

The Board on November 7 voted unanimously to donate, from the section, \$1,800 to the NCJW Israel Emergency Fund. There are many gendered aspects to this war, from the use of rape as an act of terror to the

hostage taking of babies and children. NCJW funds are being used to support organizations on the ground addressing the needs of women and children, such as the group Women Wage Peace and women in Bedouin communities.

On Giving Tuesday, all contributions to the Israel Fund were triple matched, and our members generously responded, making individual contributions of chai (\$18) or higher.

Our section continues to pursue justice here in New Orleans, most notably in the area of repro rights. Given that we have no hope of securing legislative reforms and we do not have the right to have a referendum in this state, we are going the judicial route. A committee was set up, under the leadership of Advocacy VP Sara Lewis, to explore filing a lawsuit against the abortion ban on the basis that it is restricting our

Sharing Knowledge. Multiplying Power.

'Give A Spit About Your Health; a community health fair', the third installment in NCJW's Knowledge is Power series focusing on cancer, genetics and mental health, took place on October 22nd at the Uptown ICC. Subsidized reproductive and cancer genetic mutation screening was available through Screen due to multiple generous donations, with presenting sponsors The Gayle and Tom Benson Charitable Foundation and Mr. Bob Merrick. The event was well attended organizations provided essential information about genetic testing, balance testing, a national bone marrow registry, and local services for those with cancer. Many lucky participants walked away with health-themed door prizes.

Going to Court on Behalf of Repro Rights

On the evening of November 1st at the Uptown JCC, NCJW hosted a screening of *Under G-d*, a documentary short film about the national Jewish response to the Dobbs decision - focusing on state lawsuits that argue this ruling violates the separation of church and state and infringes on religious freedom. The U.S. Supreme Court issued its ruling in this case on June 24, 2022, taking away the constitutional right to abortion.

Producer Darcy McKinnon, attorney Ellie Schilling, nationally-recognized expert on reproductive health and rights in Louisiana, and Rabbi Katie Bauman led a discussion after the screening regarding the film, the Louisiana legislative and legal landscape on abortion, and Jewish views on abortion access. More than 45 people attended the screening.

We will be forming a committee to discuss filing a similar lawsuit in Louisiana.
